

Student Support and Services

Southwestern College students are supported by many excellent services and educational resources. Furthermore, if you are comfortable doing so, please notify your instructor of any particular needs or interests you may have regarding your college experience; this will enable your instructor to brainstorm potential resources and options with you. Here are just a few of the support services that are available at Southwestern College:

Virtual Chat: During remote operations student services departments are using Cranium Café for live chat and video meetings.

Basic Needs: Need assistance with food, housing, or transportation? Connect with the Office of Student Services by e-mailing SWCOfficeofStudentServices@swccd.edu.

Career Center: provides career interest assessments and workshops to assist students in choosing a major and career.

Counseling: assists students to complete their Student Education Plan and to think critically about their college planning.

Department Directory: Need assistance from another department? Access SWC's Department Directory

Disability Support Services: provides academic accommodations for eligible students.

Dreamer Center: provides resources and services for undocumented students.

EOPS/CARE: provides counseling, tutoring, and workshops for eligible students

Financial Aid: it is not too late to apply for financial aid to cover enrollment fees and other educational expenses.

Health Services: Health Services staff are not seeing students in person, but are available via online video conference, webchat, and phone consultation.

Jaguar Justice: provides needed legal information to Southwestern College students on protesting, rental abatement, Medicare claims, domestic violence, and other topics.

Library: provides learning resource support and materials, learn about the services available online.

Personal Wellness Services: Online and remote learning can be stressful. If you are feeling anxious, stressed, sad, worried, depressed, or just need to talk with someone, contact SWC's Personal Wellness department.

Student Affairs Division: Access all of the programs and departments that are with the Student Affairs Division.

Student Employment Services: provides a listing of on-campus and off-campus jobs, along with job fairs and internship opportunities.

SWC Cares Emergency Grant: created by the Associated Student Organization (ASO) and the Southwestern College Foundation to provide assistance to students at risk of dropping out of college due to unexpected financial emergencies.

provides access to basic needs, including food, clothing, and school supplies.

Transfer Center: provides information, counseling, and workshops to assist students who want to transfer to a university.

Tutoring/Writing Center: provides free online academic support, tutoring, and information.
